



Endow Iowa

grants

2005 • Awarded \$150,000 as matching grants

- Iowa Council of Foundations- lead philanthropic entity
- Developed application and review process
- •18 applicants
- •6 awards- \$25,000 each
- Leveraged \$622,900 in private donations

Endow lowa

grants

2006 • Awarded \$50,000 as matching grants

- •8 applicants
- •3 awards- \$16,666.67 each
 - · Community Foundation of Louisa County
 - Madrid Community Endowment Fund
 - Community Foundation of Van Buren County
- Leveraged more than \$280,000 in private donations

Tax credits


- Legislation provides \$2 million per year for calendar years 2005, 2006, 2007, and somewhat more in 2008
- Tax credits for donations to qualified community foundation (permanent endowment fund)
- 1300 separate donations have been awarded tax credits to date, representing over \$25,000,000 in donations (through 2006)


Tax credits

- Credits to Date (through 2007)
 - Approx \$900,000 awarded

• Gambling revenue enhancing county-wide philanthropy

WHO?

- Qualified Community Foundations in counties that $\underline{\rm DO~NOT}$ have state-licensed gambling facilities
- Maximum of one recipient per county
- Addressing county-wide needs

County Endowment Fund

Program

County Endowment Fund Program 2005

- 2005- \$5.4 million distributed to 85 qualified Community Foundations and/or Community Affiliate Organizations
- · Amounted to \$63,601 for each organization
 - 75% to assist current countywide charitable needs/ and or organizations
 - · 25%(\$15,900) into permanent endowment funds

County Endowment Fund

Program

County Endowment Fund Program 2006

- 2006- \$5.7 million distributed to 85 qualified Community Foundations and/or Community Affiliate Organizations
- Amounted to \$67,250 for each organization
 - 75% to assist current countywide charitable needs/ and or organizations
 - 25% into permanent endowment funds

County Endowment Fund Program

When are dollars distributed?

- Funds are distributed from IDR in the fall (September or October)
- Foundations are expected to make their awards sometime by the end of the next calendar year




Capital vs. Program Grants

... which means

- Arts/Culture/Humanities 13% (capital= 9% and program= 4%),
- Education 15% (capital=7%, program=8%),
- Environment/Animals 4% (capital=3%, program=1%),
- Health 8% (capital= 4%, program= 4%),
- Human Services 27% (capital= 14%, program= 13%),
- Public/Society Benefit 33% (capital= 24%, program= 9%),
- and Other was such a small portion it equates to 0%.
